> Re: Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment KBCA, Alexandria, LA Facility ID No. 16940 LMS File No. 0000069962

Dear Licensee,

On April 8, 2019, Wilderness Communications, LLC (Wilderness), the licensee of KBCA(TV), (KBCA or Station), filed a *Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment* requesting to modify the post-incentive auction transition phase assigned to the station in the *Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice* from Phase 2 to Phase 3.¹ For the reasons below, we grant Wilderness's request for waiver and modify the Station's phase assignment to Phase 3, as conditioned herein.

Background. Pursuant to the Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice, individual stations may request waiver and modification of their phase assignment.² A waiver is appropriate where the particular facts would make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest and deviation from the general rule would relieve hardship, promote equity, or produce a more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis.³ The Media Bureau (Bureau) has stated it will evaluate such requests on a case-by-case basis to assess the impact on the transition schedule, including the impact on other broadcasters as well as viewers, in order to facilitate a timely and orderly transition.⁴ The Bureau determined that it would view favorably requests that are compliant with the Commission's rules and

have little or no impact on the transition schedule.⁵ Requests that the staff determines would be likely to delay or disrupt the transition schedule will be viewed unfavorably.⁶

KBCA is currently licensed to operate on channel 41. The Station was reassigned to channel 26 in the Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice and assigned to transition Phase 2, which has a phase testing period start date of December 1, 2018, and a phase completion date of April 12, 2019. The Station is located in the Alexandria, Louisiana, Designated Market Area (Alexandria DMA). A total of three stations, including KBCA, were repacked in the Alexandria DMA. One station transitioned in Phase 1 and two stations are assigned to Phase 2. Wilderness asserts that it has been diligently undertaking efforts to construct KBCA's post-auction facility, but as the result of heavy rains, the standing water at the Station's tower site is preventing the tower crew from staging equipment and conducting the necessary tower work. Wilderness's tower crew has therefore delayed its arrival at the tower site until late April/mid-May, and Wilderness has delayed delivery of equipment to the site until May. As a result, Wilderness requests that KBCA's transition phase be modified from Phase 2 to Phase 3, which has a testing period start date of April 13, 2019, and a phase completion date of June 21, 2019.

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that Wilderness' request to modify KBCA's phase assignment to transition to its post-auction channel in Phase 3 satisfies the requirement for a waiver and is in the public interest. We find that the change to the Station's transition phase should not have an adverse impact on the overall transition schedule or a negative impact on other stations or viewers. Staff has confirmed that the phase change will not create any new linked station sets or direct dependencies.⁹ The total number of rescan periods in the Alexandria DMA will increase from two to three, which is one more than the two rescan periods per DMA limitation used in the tool adopted by the Bureau in the Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice to assign stations to transition phases.¹⁰ Because the consumers in the Alexandria DMA will be subject to three rescan periods, we require that Wilderness air at least twice the amount of consumer education notifications required by the Rules. Based on the Station's phase change request, we believe that KBCA has diligently pursued completion of the work necessary to meet its phase completion date but has been unable to do so because of the weather and resulting conditions at the tower site. In the absence of a phase change, the station would have to go dark, and over-the-air viewers would lose access to KBCA. As a result, we find the facts and circumstances discussed above outweigh any viewer burden caused by an additional rescan period in the Alexandria DMA or a short delay in access by wireless providers to the 600 MHz band.

We remind Wilderness that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other." Additional expenses

incurred such as expenses resulting from changes in a Station's transition plan that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

Assignment and modify the transition phase assignment for KBCA from Phase 2 to Phase 3, subject to all the commitments made in its waiver request and compliance with all Commission rules applicable to transitioning stations. In particular, KBCA IS REQUIRED to air at least twice the amount of consumer education notifications required by section 73.3700(c)(3). Testing on the Station's post-auction channel may not begin until 12:01 am local time on April 13, 2019, and KBCA is required to cease operating on its pre-auction channel no later than 11:59 pm, local time, on June 21, 2019. The Station's construction permit expiration date will also be modified to correspond to its new phase completion date. 14

¹³ Each transition phase has a designated testing period on which a station in that phase may begin testing equipment on its new channel and a designated phase completion date when a station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. The phase completion date is the date that will be listed in that station's construction permit as its construction deadline and is the date the station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. A station that commences testing on its post-auction channel before the beginning of its assigned testing period will be operating in violation of Commission rules.
