Dear Licensee:

On March 20, 2020, Spectrum Solutions, LLC, licensee of low power television station WGOM-LP, Panama City, Florida (WGOM or Station) filed the above-referenced request to reinstate and extend license and silent authority (Request). For reasons set forth below, we grant the request, waive all applicable rules, and extend the Station's license and silent authority for a period of 180 days from the date of this letter.

Background. Section 312(g) of the Communications Act provides that "[i]f a broadcasting station fails to transmit broadcast signals for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, notwithstanding any provision, term, or condition of the license to the contrary, except that the Commission may extend or reinstate such station license...for any reason to promote equity and fairness."¹ In the *Incentive Auction R&O*, the Commission explained that it would be receptive to requests for reinstatement or extension of a station's license under Section 312(g), "tak[ing] into account the extent to which a station has been involuntarily forced to remain dark as a result of the repacking process and whether, in light of the facts presented, equity and fairness dictate a license extension or reinstatement and a waiver."² Further, in the *Post-Incentive Auction Procedures PN* the Media Bureau stated that, in considering requests to extend or reinstate a stations license under Section 312(g) in order to promote fairness and equity, it "will examine whether the station has demonstrated that its silence is the result of compelling reasons beyond the stations' control, including facts that relate to the post-auction transition process."³ Finally, in the *Special Displacement Window PN*, the Bureau permitted stations to file a displacement application on a contingent basis for channels in the repacked television band (channels 2-36) that full power and Class A

stations would be relinquishing as a result of the incentive auction and repacking process.⁴ The Bureau stated that, if a conditional grant would require an LPTV or TV translator station to be silent for a consecutive 12-month period prior to discontinuation of operation by the full power or Class A station, the Bureau would “consider a request for extension or reinstatement pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act and a request for waiver of the Commission rule.”⁵

Request. In its Request, SSL notes that it acquired WGOM on November 21, 2018 and upon consummation discovered that the Station had gone silent on or about October 10, 2018, as a result of damage incurred from Hurricane Michael. SSL has been attempting to rebuild the Station’s facilities. SSL states that it has obtained and has on-site the transmitter, antenna, transmission line and other equipment necessary to commence broadcasting from a proposed temporary facility. However, the Station’s consulting engineer who is responsible for overseeing construction is elderly and is practicing social distancing in an effort to avoid contact with the COVID-19 virus. SSL maintains that, once it is safe for its engineer to travel to Panama City, it will take a week to perform the necessary work to resume operations. Therefore, SSL requests relief pursuant to Section 312(g) and extension of its license and silent authority for an additional 180 days.

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that SSL’s request for relief pursuant to Section 312(g) and to extend WGOM’s license for a period of 180 days from the date of this letter satisfies the requirements of Section 312(g) as described in the *Incentive Auction R&O*, the *Post-Incentive Auction Procedures PN*, and the *Special Displacement Window PN*, and is in the public interest. Consistent with the public interest, we will provide Section 312(g) relief, including reinstatement of a station’s license, to displaced LPTV and TV translator stations that are forced off the air by circumstances beyond their control.⁶ WGOM was forced off the air as a result of hurricane damage and SSL took steps to build its facilities in a timely manner. Therefore, due to circumstances outside its control, WGOM has been unable to return to the air prior to the one-year anniversary of going silent. SSL pledges to resume operations with temporary facilities once it’s able to resume construction. Grant of relief will allow WGOM to return to the air and once again serve its viewers.

Accordingly, we find that in order to promote fairness and equity the request filed by Spectrum Solutions, LLC **IS HEREBY GRANTED**, the applicable Commission rules ARE WAIVED,⁷ and the
