Re: Request for Tolling Waiver W40CN-D, Sugar Grove, IL Facility ID No. 71111 LMS File No. 0000110239

Dear Licensee,

On March 30, 2020, Local Media TV Chicago, LLC (LMTC), the licensee of W40CN-D, Sugar Grove, Illinois (W40CN or Station), filed the above-referenced request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling of the Station's construction permit expiration date. For the reasons below, we grant LMTC's request and toll the expiration date of W40CN's construction permit through October 13, 2020.

Background. Pursuant to Section 73.3700(b)(5) of the Commission's rules (Rules), a station that was assigned a new channel as a result of the Commission's incentive auction and repacking process may request a single extension of its construction permit deadline of up to 180 days to complete construction of its post-auction facility. All subsequent requests for additional time to construct are subject to the Commission's tolling provisions of Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules. The Commission's tolling provisions provide that a construction permit deadline may be tolled under specific circumstances such as acts of God, delays due to administrative or judicial review, or construction that is delayed by any cause of action pending before a court of competent jurisdiction relating to any necessary local, state, or federal requirement for the construction or operation of the station, including any zoning or environmental requirement. If a station does not qualify for tolling under these criteria, good cause may exist to waive the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling may still be warranted where the licensee can demonstrate that "rare and exceptional circumstances" prevented construction by the station's construction permit expiration date. LMTC requests waiver of the tolling rule and tolling of its construction permit for its post-incentive auction channel facilities through October 13, 2020. W40CN has been granted an extension and

its construction permit was most extended to April 15, 2020.5 W40CN is currently silent.6

LMTC states it has diligently worked to construct its post-auction channel facilities including ordering all necessary equipment and working with the building owner and manager to complete all needed studies and drawings. However, LMTC states that its tower site uses an exclusive installer crew and LMTC has been unable to complete construction because the crew is delayed. Recently, LMTC was notified that the crew now has stopped all work because of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.<sup>7</sup> Based on the foregoing, LMTC requests that the Commission waive its tolling rule and toll the W40CN construction permit expiration date to October 13, 2020.

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that sufficient circumstances exist to waive Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules and to toll the expiration date of the Station's construction permit. LMTC has demonstrated it will be unable to complete construction of its post-auction channel facilities due to construction delays, including those resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. We also find that grant of LMTC's waiver and tolling request is not likely to negatively impact the overall transition schedule and will not cause interference to other stations. W40CN has already ceased operation on its pre-auction channel and is silent. To the extent some viewers are unable to receive W40CN's signal through alternative means while it is silent, we believe that LMTC has every incentive to ensure viewers are fully informed about the Station's transition plan. Ultimately, we conclude that the public interest will be served by grant of waiver and tolling of the Station's construction permit.

We remind LMTC that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other." Additional expenses incurred, such as expenses resulting from changes in a Stations' transition plans that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

The above facts considered, Local Media TV Chicago, LLC's request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions **IS GRANTED**. The construction permit (LMS File No. 0000034531) for W40CN-D, Sugar Grove, Illinois **IS TOLLED to October 13, 2020**. Grant of this tolling waiver does not permit W40CN to recommence operation on its pre-auction channel. We also remind LMTC

that any subsequent requests for tolling of its construction permit deadline will be subject to the Commission's tolling provisions.<sup>9</sup>
