> Re: Request for Tolling Waiver WLGA(TV), Opelika, AL Facility ID No. 11113 LMS File No. 0000112261

Dear Licensee,

On April 15, 2020, CNZ Communications SE, LLC (CNZ), the licensee of WLGA(TV), Opelika, Alabama (WLGA or Station), filed the above-referenced request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling of the Station's construction permit expiration date. For the reasons below, we grant CNZ's request and toll the expiration date of WGLA's construction permit through November 16, 2020.

Background. Pursuant to Section 73.3700(b)(5) of the Commission's rules (Rules), a station that was assigned a new channel as a result of the Commission's incentive auction and repacking process may request a single extension of its construction permit deadline of up to 180 days to complete construction of its post-auction facility. All subsequent requests for additional time to construct are subject to the Commission's tolling provisions of Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules. The Commission's tolling provisions provide that a construction permit deadline may be tolled under specific circumstances such as acts of God, delays due to administrative or judicial review, or construction that is delayed by any cause of action pending before a court of competent jurisdiction relating to any necessary local, state, or federal requirement for the construction or operation of the station, including any zoning or environmental requirement. If a station does not qualify for tolling under these criteria, good cause may exist to waive the Commission's tolling provisions and tolling may still be warranted where the licensee can demonstrate that "rare and exceptional circumstances" prevented construction by the station's construction permit expiration date. CNZ requests waiver of the tolling rule and tolling of its construction permit for its post-incentive auction channel facilities through November 16, 2020. CNZ was granted an extension and two tolling

waivers of the expiration date of its construction permit which now expires on May 20, 2020.⁵ CNZ is in the process of constructing a Distributed Transmission System (DTS) network. CNZ has completed construction of DTS site #1, from which it is currently operating, and is working to complete construction of DTS site #2. Although it intended to complete construction prior to its construction deadline, delays relating to the COVID-19 pandemic have made it unlikely that DTS site #2 will be ready by that date.⁶ Accordingly, CNZ requests that the Commission waive its tolling rule and toll WLGA's construction permit expiration date to November 16, 2020.

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that sufficient circumstances exist to waive Section 73.3598(b) of the Rules and to reinstate and toll the expiration date of the Station's construction permit. CNZ has demonstrated it will be unable to complete construction of its post-auction channel facilities due to construction delays completing its DTS #2 site. We also find that grant of CNZ's waiver and tolling request is not likely to negatively impact the overall transition schedule and will not cause interference to other stations. WLGA has already ceased operation on its pre-auction channel and is operating an interim facility on its post-auction channel. To the extent some viewers are unable to receive WLGA's signal while it operates its interim facilities, we believe that CNZ has every incentive to ensure viewers are fully informed about the Station's transition plan. Ultimately, we conclude that the public interest will be served by reinstatement of the Station's construction permit and grant of waiver and tolling of the Station's construction permit.

We remind CNZ that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other." Additional expenses incurred, such as expenses resulting from changes in a station's transition plans that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

The above facts considered, CNZ Communications SE, LLC's request for waiver of the Commission's tolling provisions **IS GRANTED**. The construction permit for WLGA(TV), Opelika, Alabama, **IS TOLLED to November 16, 2020.** Grant of this tolling waiver does not permit WLGA to

recommence operation on its pre-auction channel. We also remind CNZ that any subsequent requests for tolling of its construction permit deadline will be subject to the Commission's tolling provisions.⁸
