> Re: Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment WGNT(TV), Portsmouth, VA Facility ID No. 9762 LMS File No. 0000081042

Dear Licensee,

On September 9, 2019, Local TV Virginia License, LLC (Local TV), the licensee of WGNT(TV), Portsmouth, Virginia, (WGNT or Station), filed a *Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment* requesting to modify the post-incentive auction transition phase assigned to the Station in the *Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice* from Phase 7 to Phase 9. For the reasons below, we grant Local TV's request for waiver and modify the Station's phase assignment to Phase 9, as conditioned herein.

Background. Pursuant to the Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice, individual stations may request waiver and modification of their phase assignment.² A waiver is appropriate where the particular facts would make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest and deviation from the general rule would relieve hardship, promote equity, or produce a more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis.³ The Media Bureau (Bureau) has stated it will evaluate such requests on a case-by-case basis to assess the impact on the transition schedule, including the impact on other broadcasters as well as viewers, in order to facilitate a timely and orderly transition.⁴ The Bureau determined that it would view favorably requests that are compliant with the Commission's rules and

have little or no impact on the transition schedule.⁵ Requests that the staff determines would be likely to delay or disrupt the transition schedule will be viewed unfavorably.⁶

WGNT is currently licensed to operate on channel 50. It was reassigned to channel 20 in the Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice and is currently assigned to transition Phase 7, which has a phase testing period start date of October 19, 2019, and a phase completion date of January 17, 2020. The Station is located in the Norfolk-Portsmouth-Newport News, Virginia, Designated Market Area (Norfolk DMA). A total of 12 stations were repacked in the Norfolk DMA, with eight stations, including WGNT, being assigned to Phase 7 and four stations being assigned to Phase 9.7 Local TV states that WGNT will share its post-auction tower and antenna with repacked stations WTKR-TV, Norfolk, VA (WTKR-TV), and WHRO-TV, Hampton-Norfolk, VA (WHRO-TV).8 Both WTKR-TV and WHRO-TV are located in the Norfolk DMA and are assigned to transition Phase 9. According to Local TV, grant of its phase change request would result in a more efficient use of repack resources by allowing the same tower crew to perform all the required tower work at the same time.⁹ Local TV has also been informed by its tower owner, American Tower Corporation, that the tower crew it has contracted with to conduct the tower work is delayed and that it may not be able to complete the necessary tower work in time to complete WGNT's post-auction facility by January 17, 2020.10 As a result, Local TV has filed a waiver request seeking to change its phase assignment from Phase 7 to Phase 9, which has a testing period start date of March 14, 2020, and has a phase completion date of May 1, 2020.

Because the Station is currently operating in the 600 MHz band, Local-TV asserts that this phase change will not create any new linked-station sets, direct dependencies, or increased temporary pairwise interference greater than two percent during the transition period. In order to mitigate any viewer disruption caused by the change in phase, Local TV commits to conduct additional consumer outreach beyond what is required by the Commission's rules by maintaining a link on its website and associated social media platforms educating viewers about the rescan process and the timing for WGNT's transition. Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that Local TV's request to modify the phase assignment for WGNT to transition to its post-auction channel satisfies the requirement for a waiver and is in the public interest. We agree that changing the Station's transition phase to Phase 9 should not have an adverse impact on the overall transition schedule or a negative

impact on other stations or viewers. Staff has confirmed that the phase change will not create any new linked station sets, direct dependencies, or increased pairwise interference greater than two percent. The total number of rescan periods in the Norfolk DMA will remain the same.¹³ As a result, we find the facts and circumstances discussed above outweigh any viewer burden caused by a change in the Station's transition phase and a short delay in access by wireless licensees to the Station's pre-auction channel.

We remind Local TV that pursuant to the Spectrum Act, the Station is eligible for reimbursement from the TV Broadcast Relocation Fund (Fund) of costs "reasonably incurred . . . in order for the licensee to relocate its television service from one channel to the other." Additional expenses incurred such as expenses resulting from changes in a Station's transition plan that are not related to the post-incentive auction channel change, may not be reimbursable from the Fund.

Accordingly, we **GRANT** Local TV's Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment and modify the transition phase assignment for WGNT from Phase 7 to Phase 9, subject to any commitments made in its waiver request and compliance with all Commission rules applicable to transitioning stations. Testing on the Station's post-auction channel may not begin until 12:01 am local time on March 14, 2020, and WGNT is required to cease operating on its pre-auction channel no

later than 11:59 pm local time on May 1, 2020.¹⁶ The Station's construction permit expiration date will also be modified to correspond to its new phase completion date.¹⁷

¹⁶ Each transition phase has a designated testing period on which a station in that phase may begin testing equipment on its new channel and a designated phase completion date when a station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. The phase completion date is the date that will be listed in that station's construction permit as its construction deadline and is the date the station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. *See Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice*, 32 FCC Rcd at 2806, para. 64. A station that commences testing on its post-auction channel before the beginning of its assigned testing period will be operating in violation of Commission rules.
