> RE: W220BK(FX), Logan, WV Facility ID No. 81396 Silent since November 3, 2023 Request for Special Temporary Authority to Remain Silent

Dear Ms. Hiner:

This letter concerns the request you filed on December 4, 2023, on behalf of West Virginia Educational Broadcasting Authority (WVEBA), for Special Temporary Authority (STA) to permit FM Translator Station W220BK to remain silent.

WVEBA's request states that Station W220BK went silent on November 3, 2023, for technical reasons.

WVEBA's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station W220BK to remain silent not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station W220BK will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not resume by 12:01 a.m., November 4, 2024.¹

WVEBA is required to notify the Commission when broadcast operations resume.² If WVEBA does not file the notification of resumption of operations in a timely manner, the license may be subject to cancellation pursuant to section 312(g) of the Communications Act, as amended.³

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. In the event of license cancellation, it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed.⁴

² In addition, periods of operation pursuant to this STA shall be recorded in the station's records (see 47 CFR §§ 73.1820 (AM/FM/TV), 73.877 (LPFM) and/or 74.1281 (FM translator)). The records shall include start/stop dates and times of such operation. These log entries must be maintained for a minimum of two years as specified in 47 CFR § 73.1840(a), unless a longer retention period is requested by the staff. Periods of operation may be subject to independent verification that they in fact occurred.

Finally, section 73.1740(a)(4) of the Commission's Rules permits licensees to temporarily discontinue operations for good cause, and for a period not to exceed 30 days without further authority.⁵ This rule requires that the licensee notify the Commission by letter not later than the 10th day of limited or discontinued operations, and requires a licensee to seek Commission authorization for any period of limited or discontinued operations exceeding 30 days. WVEBA failed to submit a timely request for an STA to permit Station W220BK to remain silent beyond December 3, 2023, and the action taken herein shall not be construed as a waiver of section 73.1740(a)(4) or as authorizing the station to remain silent between December 3, 2023, and December 4, 2023.
