This Permit Modifies Permit No.: 950901MG

Subject to the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, subsequent acts and treaties, and all regulations heretofore or hereafter made by this Commission, and further subject to the conditions set forth in this permit, the permittee is hereby authorized to construct the radio transmitting apparatus herein described. Installation and adjustment of equipment not specifically set forth herein shall be in accordance with representations contained in the permittee's application for construction permit except for such modifications as are presently permitted, without application, by the Commission's Rules.

Commission rules which became effective on February 16, 1999, have a bearing on this construction permit. See Report & Order, Streamlining of Mass Media Applications, MM Docket No. 98-43, 13 FCC RCD 23056, Para. 77-90 (November 25, 1998); 63 Fed. Reg. 70039 (December 18, 1998). Pursuant to these rules, this construction permit will be subject to automatic forfeiture unless construction is complete and an application for license to cover is filed prior to expiration. See Section 73.3598.

Equipment and program tests shall be conducted only pursuant to Sections 73.1610 and 73.1620 of the Commission's Rules.

- 1 The permittee/licensee must reduce power or cease operation as necessary to protect persons having access to the site, tower or antenna from radiofrequency electromagnetic fields in excess of FCC guidelines.

Special operating conditions or restrictions:

- 2 THE AUTOMATIC PROGRAM TEST PROVISIONS OF 47 C.F.R. SECTION 73.1620 DO NOT APPLY IN THIS CASE. A FORMAL REQUEST FOR PROGRAM TEST AUTHORITY MUST BE FILED IN CONJUNCTION WITH FCC FORM 302-FM, APPLICATION FOR LICENSE, BEFORE PROGRAM TESTS WILL BE AUTHORIZED. This request should be submitted at least 10 days prior to the date on which program tests are desired to commence. This request must contain documentation which demonstrates compliance with the following special operating condition(s):
- 3 Permittee shall submit a statement certifying that a fence has been constructed at least 29 meters from the base of the tower and in such a manner as to prevent the exposure of humans to radiofrequency radiation in excess of the American National Standards Institute Guidelines in OST bulletin No. 65, October 1985. The fence must be of a type which will preclude casual or inadvertent access, and must include warning signs at appropriate intervals which describe the nature of the hazard.
- 4 Documentation demonstrating compliance with the special operating condition(s) may be submitted in advance of the filing of FCC Form 302-FM. The Commission's staff will review it for compliance and respond by letter stating whether automatic PTA has been reinstated.
- 5 Permittee has specified use of a five section antenna to demonstrate compliance with the ANSI radiofrequency radiation limit. If any other type or size of antenna is to be used with the facilities authorized herein, THE AUTOMATIC PROGRAM TEST PROVISIONS OF 47 C.F.R. SECTION 73.1620 WILL NOT APPLY. In this case, a FORMAL REQUEST FOR PROGRAM TEST AUTHORITY must be filed in conjunction with FCC Form 302-FM, application for license, BEFORE program tests will be authorized. This request should be made at least 10 days prior to the date on which program tests are desired to commence. The request must include a revised radiofrequency radiation showing to demonstrate continued compliance with the ANSI limit.

Documentation demonstrating compliance with the ANSI radiofrequency radiation limit may be submitted in advance of the filing of FCC Form 302-FM. The Commission's staff will review it for compliance and respond by letter stating whether automatic PTA has been reinstated.
