**OPPOSITION TO SUPPLEMENTS TO INFORMAL OBJECTION**

Centro Cristiano de Vida Eterna (“CCVE”) hereby responds to the Supplements dated March 7, March 9, March 14, March 15, and March 23, 2021 to the Informal Objection Informal Objection filed by Albert Adam David with respect to the pending application of CCVE for renewal of W252AW.<sup>1</sup>

**Background**

Station W252AW was off the air due to interference caused to residents on the top floor of its roof of its transmitter site. Station W252AW had ceased operation on March 6, 2020. Therefore, in order to maintain its license, Station W252AW was required to resume operations no later than 12:01 AM on March 7, 2021. In accordance with that schedule, on February 26, 2021, CCVE requested issuance of a Special Temporary Authority to permit operation at a lower power in order to resume operations while alleviating the interference problem to residents, which was granted on March 4, 2021. Station W252AW thereafter resumed operation on March 5, 2021. As the Resumption Notice filed with the FCC states:

THE STATION RESUMED OPERATIONS MARCH 5, 2021 WHEN PRIMARY  
STATION WRLI CAME ON AIR AT 10PM LOCAL TIME WITH PARAMETERS

APPROVED ON MARCH 4, 2021 IN BSTA-20210226AAJ, WITH AN ERP OF 50 WATTS UNDER STA AUTHORITY.

THE OPERATION OF THE TRANSLATOR WAS VERIFIED AT THE TIME THE STATION RESUMED OPERATIONS, WHILE AT THE TRANSMITTER SITE. THE TRANSLATOR'S OVER-THE AIR OPERATION WAS FURTHER VERIFIED BY MONITORING THE STATION WHEN THE TECHNICIAN TRAVELED HOME THAT EVENING. ALTHOUGH THE RANGE WAS SOMEWHAT LESS THAN BEFORE, THE STATION COULD BE HEARD OVER-THE-AIR IN THE PROXIMITY OF THE TRANSMITTER SITE.

THE STATION REMAINED ON AIR MARCH 6, 2021, AS IT WAS HEARD BY THE STATION TECHNICIAN ON THE WAY TO AN OFFICE AT 3510 MICHIGAN, IN CHICAGO AT 830 AM. IT WAS ALSO STILL ON THE AIR AT NOON ON MARCH 6, 2021, WHEN IT WAS AGAIN MONITORED, DURING A LUNCH BREAK.

THE PRIMARY STATION OF THIS TRANSLATOR IS WRLL-AM WHICH IS ONE OF THE FEW REMAINING SHARE TIME AM STATIONS STILL OPERATING UNDER SUCH AUTHORITY. WRLL LEAVES THE AIR AT 1PM ON A DAILY BASIS AND RETURNS TO THE AIR AT 10PM.

ON THE MORNING OF MARCH 7 IT WAS NOTED THAT THE TRANSLATOR WAS OFF AIR. A TECHNICIAN WENT TO THE TRANSMISSION SITE THAT MORNING. GOING UP TO THE TRANSMITTER ROOM, IT WAS DISCOVERED THAT THE OUTLET THAT FEEDS THE TRANSMITTER IS A GROUND FAULT INTERRUPTER (GFI) OUTLET WHICH HAD TRIPPED AND STOPPED POWER TO THE TRANSMITTER. IT IS ASSUMED THIS MAY HAVE OCCURRED WHEN THE TRANSMITTER ATTEMPTED TO START AT 10PM MARCH 6, 2021, WHEN WRLL STARTED ITS BROADCAST 'DAY.' THE OUTLET WAS RESET AND THE CARRIER RETURNED TO AIR. THE STATION RESUMED OPERATIONS IMMEDIATELY AT APPROXIMATELY 11:20 AM CENTRAL TIME ON MARCH 7, 2021. THE STATION REMAINS ON THE AIR TO COINCIDE WITH THE CURRENT OPERATING SCHEDULE OF WRLL. THE TRANSLATOR SUSPENDS PROGRAMMING ON A DAILY BASIS FROM 1PM UNTIL 10PM IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE WRLL LICENSE.

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<sup>2</sup> The station was heard on-the-air at Noon on March 6, 2021. At the time of filing of the Resumption Notice, it was speculated that the CGI circuit at 10 p.m. See Attachment 1. As Albert David correctly states (March 14 Supplement at 1), WRLL begins its Saturday evening broadcast day at 8:30 PM. CCVE's technical consultant and its counsel did not recall that fact when preparing the Resumption Notice. Therefore, the CFI circuit tripped sometime Saturday after noon, and it is possible that that CFI circuit tripped at 8:30 p.m., when the transmitter attempted to begin its broadcast "day" on the evening of March 6, 2021. As noted, power was restored to the transmitter the following morning, on March 7, 2021 at approximately 11:20 AM, local time.

<sup>3</sup> As noted, Station W252AW rebroadcasts WRLL. As a share-time station, Station WRLL is authorized to operate only from M-F 12:00 AM to 1 PM and 10 PM – Midnight; Saturday 12:00 AM – 1 PM and 8:30 PM – Midnight; and Sunday 12:00 AM – 5:00 AM, and 10PM – Midnight.

### **Allegations**

Albert David has made a series of shifting, and at times, contradictory, allegations with regard to the operations of Station W252AW.<sup>4</sup> In the March 7 Supplement (Pleading File No. 0000138042), Albert David alleged that Station W252AW did not timely resume operations, noting times he monitored the Station's frequency, all of which were at times *before* the STA even was granted<sup>5</sup>, or else during short period of time during which Station W252AW experienced technical difficulties with a power outlet and was off the air<sup>6</sup>, as "proof" that the Station did not timely resume operations.<sup>7</sup> In the March 9 Supplement (Pleading File No. 0000138202), Albert David reported that he indeed now could hear Station W252AW operating, but again alleged that the Station had not timely resumed operations. In the March 14 Supplement (Pleading File No. 0000139394), Albert David verified that Station W252AW is properly rebroadcasting Station WRLL(AM), but complained that the Station was continuing to operate when Station WRLL is off the air; alleged also that there was no identification of the translator's call letters; and generally alleged a violation of 47 U.S.C. § 312(a)(1) ("false statements knowingly made ... in the application"). In the March 15 Supplement (Pleading File No. 0000139627), Albert David alleged a violation of 47 C.F.R. § 74.1263(b), "which permit a translator to broadcast when the station it

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<sup>4</sup> It should be noted that none of the claims in the Supplements were made under penalty of perjury. Allegations of fact, except for those of which official notice may be taken, must be supported by an affidavit or declaration under penalty of perjury of someone with personal knowledge of the facts alleged. *Tribune Media Company*, 34 FCC Rcd 8437, 8448 ¶ 23 (2019). In other words, petitions to deny or informal objections must provide properly supported allegations of fact that, if true, would establish a substantial and material question of fact that grant of the application would be prima facie inconsistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity. *Accord*, 47 U.S.C. 309(d); *Rock'n'Roll Preservation Society*, 23 FCC Rcd 16630, 16638 (MB 2008), aff'd *Six Applications*, 28 FCC Rcd 13390, 13399-13401 (2013) (statements made in an unsworn declaration were unreliable without corroborating evidence).

is broadcasting is off the air only in the case of Class D AM stations, whose translators are permitted to broadcast during nighttime hours if the AM station has operated in the past 24 hours.” In the March 23 Supplement (Pleading File No. 0000140872), Albert David conceded that in actuality he “cannot prove” that Station W252AW did not in fact timely resume operations for period of times prior to 12:00 AM March 7, 2021 (although without supporting facts, he “personally believe[s]” that it did not), and concedes also that there would only have been a violation of the Commission’s Station identification rules if the Station were operating pursuant to Section 74.1282(c)(2) of the Commission’s Rules. March 23 Supplement at 1.

### **Discussion**

Therefore, dealing with the four new matters raised in the Supplements, the following is stated:

First, there clearly was no violation of Section 312(g) of the Communications Act. Station W252AW ceased operation on March 6, 2020, and in order to maintain its license, Station W252AW was required to resume operations no later than 12:01 AM on March 7, 2021. Station W252AW was granted a new engineering STA for operation at reduced power on March 4, 2021, and the Station resumed operations on March 5, 2021 at 10 PM, and no information filed by Albert David establishes otherwise. Therefore, Station W252AW resumed operations prior to the expiration of the one-year deadline provided for in Section 312(g) of the Communications Act.<sup>8</sup>

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<sup>8</sup> This also has been confirmed by a filing made with the FCC by Mr. Larry Langford in this proceeding, who stated:

I see an informal objection and amendments have been filed in the case of W252AW returning to the air before the 12 month silence limit.

On March 5, 2021 shortly after 10pm I monitored W252AW operating on air as I listened from my home 60th and Bishop on the south-side of Chicago. I stopped listening well past midnight. The programming was Spanish language and music.

The only times Mr. David reports the Station was off the air were times *before* the Station recommenced operation (*i.e.*, before the STA even was granted)<sup>9</sup>, or else during short period of time during which Station W252AW experienced technical difficulties and was off the air.<sup>10</sup> Therefore, no basis exists for termination of the W252AW license under Section 312(g) of the Communications Act.<sup>11</sup>

Albert David also alleged violation of the Commission's station identification Rules. March 14 Supplement at 2. Not only does that allegation provide no basis for a "denial" of a license renewal application, this claim also was essentially withdrawn by Albert David in the March 23, 2021 Supplement.<sup>12</sup>

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On the morning of March 6, 2021 W252AW was still on air as I drove to my office at 3510 South Michigan. I was not able to hear the station inside my office but did again here it as I left for a meeting at 1130am.

My reputation is a matter of record before the Commission and I while I have filed objections on the licensee of this station in the past, I would be remiss if I did not advise that the station did in fact return to on air status before the one year deadline.

<sup>12</sup> Therein, Albert David states:

I covered many points in my supplemental filing dated March 14, 2021, pleading file number: 0000139394, and feel I must clarify several points. In this filing, I stated that there was no identification of the translator's call sign between 12:55 PM and 1:05 PM, as required by 47 CFR Section 74.1283(c)(1). I acknowledge that this is only a violation if the station is operating pursuant to 47 CFR Section 74.1283(c)(1) and not 47 CFR Section 74.1283(c)(2).

March 23 Supplement at 1 (emphasis added). Pleading File No. 0000140872.

Third, the fact that Station W252AW was off the air from Saturday evening (March 6, 2021) until Sunday morning (March 7, 2021) due to a CFI power outlet tripping does not warrant denial of CCVE's renewal application. Pursuant to Section 74.1263(a) of the Commission's Rules, "[t]he licensee of an FM translator or booster station is not required to adhere to any regular schedule of operation" and is only required to "provide a dependable service to the extent that such is within its control and to avoid unwarranted interruptions to the service provided." 47 C.F.R. § 74.1262(a). The interruption of power to the transmitter was a circumstance beyond CCVE's control, which has not occurred since. The one-time interruption of service also does not warrant denial of the renewal application.

Finally, Albert David also alleges violation of Section 74.1263(b) of the Commission's Rules. March 14 Supplement at 2; March 15 Supplement at 2. Section 74.1263(b), as adopted in 1990, stated:

(b) An FM booster or translator station rebroadcasting the signal of an AM, FM, or LPFM primary station shall not be permitted to radiate during extended periods when signals of the primary station are not being retransmitted. Notwithstanding the foregoing, FM translators rebroadcasting Class D AM stations may continue to operate during nighttime hours only if the AM station has operated within the last 24 hours.

*Amendment of Part 74 of the FM Commission's Rules Concerning Translator Stations*, 5 FCC Rcd 7212, 7242 (1990).<sup>13</sup> Section 74.1263(b) is a Rule established to prohibit local origination of

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<sup>13</sup> The most recent version of the C.F.R. recites the rule as stating:

(b) A booster station rebroadcasting the signal of an AM, FM, or LPFM primary station shall not be permitted to radiate during extended periods when signals of the primary station are not being retransmitted. Notwithstanding the foregoing, FM translators rebroadcasting Class D AM stations may continue to operate during nighttime hours only if the AM station has operated within the last 24 hours.

47 C.F.R. § 74.1263(b) (emphasis added). However, the Rule, as adopted previously by the Commission, states:

(b) An FM booster or FM translator station rebroadcasting the signal of an AM or FM primary station shall not be permitted to radiate during extended periods when signals of the primary station are not being retransmitted. Notwithstanding the foregoing, FM translators rebroadcasting Class D AM stations may continue to operate during nighttime hours only if the AM station has operated within the last 24 hours.

programming by FM translators and FM boosters. “Sections 74.1231(b) and 74.1263(b) of the Rules prohibit an FM translator station from originating programming while its primary station is off the air, except under limited circumstances.” *Alabama Media, LLC*, 34 FCC Rcd 1913, 1918 ¶ 12 (MB 2019). To the extent Albert David is implying that Station W252AW is broadcasting or originating programming when its primary station is off the air, Albert David is providing false allegations to the FCC. The primary station of this translator is WRLL(AM), which is one of the few remaining share time AM stations still operating under such authority. Station WRLL generally leaves the air at 1 PM on a daily basis and returns to the air at 10 PM. *Cf.* footnote 3, *supra*. Even though the share-time station shared with WRLL is off the air, Station W252AW *also* suspends programming on a daily basis in accordance with the WRLL license. There was no “misrepresentation” in that regard.<sup>14</sup> More importantly, Station W252AW has no program origination capability, and consequently, at no time has Station W252AW ever originated programming (or even “radiated” for “extended periods”) when Station WRLL is not broadcasting programming, in violation of Section 74.1263(b).

In short, the Supplements provide no basis for the denial of the W252AW renewal application. The Supplements are not under penalty of perjury, and fail totally to provide independent information supporting its allegations.<sup>15</sup> The allegations are based on generally

<sup>15</sup> Under Section 309(d) of the Communications Act, a petitioner must submit “specific allegations of fact sufficient to show that the petitioner is a party in interest and that a grant of the application would be *prima facie* inconsistent” with the public interest, convenience, and necessity served by granting the application. 47 U.S.C. §

speculation and surmise and a misreading and/or misunderstanding of the Commission's Rules and regulations, both which are not the proper basis for an objection filed before the FCC for denial of a license renewal application.<sup>16</sup> For all of these reasons, the Informal Objection must be denied.

**WHEREFORE**, it is requested that the Informal Objection filed by Albert Adam David dated October 23, 2020, and Supplemented on March 7, March 9, March 14, March 15, and March 23, 2021, be denied.

The petitioner must also make a demonstration of a desire, motive, or logical reason to mislead in order to have an issue added. The Commission will not infer actual or attempted deceptions or improper motives from an enumeration of alleged application errors, omissions, or inconsistencies, accompanied by speculation and surmise but lacking factual support.").
