Dear Mr. James Bradshaw,

We recently received a copy of yet another letter from Gregory Masters and Kathleen Kirby of Wiley Rein LLP addressed to Marlene H. Dortch, Esq., Secretary, Federal Communications Commission. The letter was concerning Interference letters and Filings that have been sent to the FCC regarding the application submitted by the Parties to renew the KKOL(AM) License. (Files Nos. 000150697 and 000161926). Like the previous letters from these parties, it is my opinion that the content of this letter is insulting, confusing, misleading and intended to distract from the concerns that Eileen and I have over the application to broadcast KKOL(AM) at a power of 50Kw from their antenna located directly behind our home in the city of Bainbridge Island. The letter to the Secretary was sent on September 29, 2022. I assume that Mr. Masters and Ms. Kirby are on the payroll of Wiley Rein LLP and are paid to write these letters. I am not paid but take time to respond because I feel that it is necessary to protect my interests. As with my last letter, I have decided to dispense with the time needed to write a well crafted letter and will simply try to respond to issues raised.

1. I first thought that maybe this letter was not addressing the same application by KKOL that we have been corresponding about. Nowhere that I could find does the letter acknowledge that Salem intends to broadcast at 50 Kw. I have always been careful to say that my objections have always been to the application to broadcast at 50 Kw.
2. What electronic equipment is "covered"? When was the list of "covered" equipment last updated? What about all of the equipment that has not yet been invented?
3. Salem states that will continue to provide "technical assistance" in determining the cause of the problem and "advice" on corrective measures. So, I guess that we, the residents, are left with actually identifying the problem and fixing the issue.
4. I am sorry that Inspiration Media is experiencing "financial distress" but the disruptions in our lives caused by issues resulting from blanketing interference constitute countervailing public interest.
5. As Mr. Lockwood of Hatfield and Dawson observes, "this AM broadcast facility has existed at its present site for many years". What Mr. Lockwood conveniently
