**REPORT OF PRELIMINARY REIMBURSEMENT**

Prescott Valley Broadcasting Co. Inc. (“PVBC”), by its counsel, hereby files this Report of Preliminary Reimbursement, in compliance with the last Ordering Clause set forth in *Prescott Valley Broadcasting Co. Inc.*, DA 22-606, rel. June 6, 2022 (“June 6 Letter”). Among other things, the June 6 Letter required that Entravision Holdings, LLC (“Entravision”) provide reimbursement to PVBC for certain amounts listed in the June 6 Letter, in the amount of \$17,931.

PVBC hereby confirms that on June 9, 2022, it received from Entravision the amount of \$17,931. However, as set forth in PVBC’s Report Regarding Progress of Negotiations and Preliminary Assessment of Legitimate and Prudent Expenses (filed February 24, 2022), the Update thereto, filed by PVBC on March 4, 2022, and PVBC’s Response to Information Requests, filed on June 21, 2022, the \$17,931 received to date from Entravision is not nearly enough to cover all of PVBC’s anticipated expenses associated with properly and fully informing listeners to KPPV(FM), Prescott Valley, Arizona (“KPPV”) regarding the proposed change of that station’s channel from 106.7 to 106.9 MHz. Such change in KPPV’s channel would be effectuated solely for Entravision’s benefit, and would be to the detriment to PVBC and KPPV’s listeners.

As set forth in PVBC’s prior private communications with Entravision, as well as PVBC’s prior pleadings submitted to the Commission, PVBC will be expecting significant additional
